

PUMP EFFICIENCY TESTING

Are you a commercial farmer or rancher located in Escondido, Valley Center or Ramona, and operate your working land using a well and/or booster pump? You could be eligible for a subsidized pump efficiency test! RCD will cover up to \$500 of the cost. The pump testing company will be in these areas on **Wednesday**, **May 3rd**, with limited availability.

These test results are a required component of applying to the <u>CDFA SWEEP</u> program, which funds upgrades to pumps and irrigation systems.

COUNTY OF SAN DIEGO AGRICULTURAL PASS PROGRAM PHASE 2

This program allows commercial agriculture or livestock operators access to restricted areas to care for crops and animals during a disaster.

Permissible access includes:

- For livestock operations sheltering, moving, transporting, evacuating, feeding, watering, or administering veterinary care to livestock
- For agricultural operations work on irrigation systems, farm equipment, and other essential infrastructure

GRANT FUNDING, RELIEF AND SCHOLARSHIPS

BUSINESS SUPPORT

Disaster Relief for Organic Farmers (May 12)

Is your farm certified organic? CCOF offers up to \$5,000 in relief for economic impacts from natural disasters - *visit their website in April* to view the application.

Disaster Relief for Livestock Producers and Farmers (June 2)

USDA is providing relief funding in two phases for livestock producers and commercial farmers impacted by drought, wildfires and other natural disasters through the Emergency Livestock Relief Program (ELRP) and the Emergency Relief Program (ERP). <u>Learn more and apply here.</u>

Drought Relief for Smallscale Farmers (July 15)

Was your farm business impacted by drought in the last two years? CARCD offers up to \$20,000 for smallscale farms - <u>view the application online</u> in your language. Need help applying? Reach out to Elizabeth (<u>elizabeth.garcia@rcdsandiego.org</u>).

Restore CA Carbon Farming Grants (July 20)

Zero Foodprint is offering \$450,000 total for California farmers and ranchers to implement projects that sequester carbon such as cover cropping, prescribed grazing and other regenerative practices. Each applicant can request up to \$25,000. <u>Apply here.</u>

CONSERVATION PRACTICES

Western Sustainable Agriculture Research and Education (May 23)

Projects must incorporate research and education, and bring together a team of researchers, students, ag professionals, and producers. \$350,000 maximum, duration 1-3 years. <u>Apply here.</u>

Restore California (July 20)

Zero Foodprint is a private organization that funds farms to implement soil conservation practices which store carbon. Up to \$22,000 per producer. *Apply here*.

Compost Connector (Rolling)

Subsidized compost material and delivery from a certified facility of your choice. Offered to working farms and ranches by Zero Foodprint. *Apply here*.

Environmental Quality Incentives Program (Rolling)

The US Department of Agriculture offers agricultural producers a cost-share to address resource concerns like flooding, erosion and soil health. Applications are accepted year-round and the next review date is April 3rd. <u>Learn how to apply here</u>.
