The Working Lands for Pollinators Program is focused on improving habitat on farms, ranches and private lands. Habitat loss is one of the primary factors contributing to pollinator decline. Farms and ranches can help by creating intentional habitat to provide food and shelter for beneficial insects, while benefiting from the free services of pollination and pest-controlling insects.

Program partners offer free, non-regulatory technical assistance and funding to help farmers and ranchers establish habitat for pollinators and other beneficial insects.

The many benefits of habitat plantings:

Natural pest control • Beautification • Improved pollination • Erosion control
Improved soil health • Shade for workers or livestock • Farm ecosystem health

Support includes:

- Species selection tailored to your space & goals
- Planting design
- Reimbursement for plants and supplies
- Training on habitat maintenance
- Support with pollinator monitoring

Requirements:

- Irrigate for the first year after planting
- Ensure project remains in place for the plants' lifespan
- Support monitoring for plant health & insect activity
